- Some of the things that I would change would be:
- For the basketball lectures chance to talk with Prof. Mario Jelicic because he had some great things to say in the seminar, and would include more talk with him because he has so much useful information to share with the students.
- For the lectures with Prof. Milavic I would make them more interactive and include the students more in the classes, I liked very much that the professor was open for advice and material after the class. Maybe shorten the material because it can be confusing to memorize so much information in such little time. (I would maybe put more attention on basketball and than to connect that with psychology). But most importantly to get the students involved because it is interesting subject and the professor know a lot about it.
- For the lectures with Prof. Nemai I think they are very good and useful classes and the professor is very good at explaining things and getting the students involved. I would make all of the exel and video examples with basketball, it will be much easier for the students to memorize and connect things if there is basketball involved. About the dartfish program, I think it is very good program but the problem is we didn't get a chance to fully understand how the software works.
 - What I would change is make the software tutorial live so the students can ask questions if something is not clear to them. Also for the video analysis task I feel like it should be required all for all the students to make the video in the same software, so we can look at the videos objectively in the way that it is done now students with previous knowledge of other editing programs have a lot of advantages and don't even use the dartfish program at all, so the point of the task is lost. Also I would put more focus in the analysis part than on the video looks and editing, this way we can be judged on what we analyse and not the way the video looks.





MASTER THESIS

The Director of a study programme shall put a list of Final Theses topics or themes on the University website **is.lsu.lt before 15 February, 2025.** The list shall be drawn up with regard to the study programme teachers, laboratory researchers, students and social partners' offers. The topics shall be related to the field of the study programme.

Each student shall select a Final Thesis topic or a theme as well as a scientific supervisor on the website before **02 March**, **2025.** In case a student fails to meet the deadline, a Final Thesis topic and a scientific supervisor shall be allocated following the decision of the Study Programme Committee.

The Study Programme Committee, having regard to the students' choices, shall draw up a list of students, topics for Final Theses, scientific supervisors and advisers (if needed), approve it and announce in the University Academic Information System before the end of the second month of the first semester. In case of a competition (if more than one student pretends to one theme), the priority shall be given to a better student (in accordance with his/ her weighted average) and / or to the student who has more experience in the field and / or to the student who has proposed the topic.

Final Theses topics can be specified and scientific supervisors can be changed, but not later than one semester before the submission of the Thesis for final evaluation (exception – termination of the employment agreement between the supervisor and the University or other unforeseen circumstances).

Submit your application online till **30.06.2025.** via: https://is.lsu.lt/. Additional documents as copy of diploma or recognition document from SKVC needs to submitted latest **20.08.2025.**


Documents to be attached when applying online:

- 1. Copy of the passport (for non EU citizens) or ID card (only for EU and EEA citizens);
- 2. One recent passport size photo (3x4cm.);
- 3. Copies of the documents of previous education and its supplements (Transcripts of Records/Mark Sheets) in original language and translated into English (a secondary school certificate, university diploma, etc.) certified by Notary and approved by an Apostille (for citizens of countries acceding to 1961 Hague Convention);
- 4. Recognition document of foreign qualifications issued by the Lithuanian Centre for Quality Assessment in Higher Education (Lietuvos studijų kokybės vertinimo centras SKVC)*;
- 5. CV (Resume);
- 6. The copy of the certificate that shows the proficiency level B2 in the English language, or corresponding IELTS 6.0, or TOEFL 5.50 certificates. It is not applicable for the applicants whose education is acquired in English;
- 7. Copy of the proof of payment of the application fee of 150 Eur
